



St. Marys AOC Habitat Restoration

Status of the St. Marys AOC

- In 1987 Areas of Concern (AOCs) were designated under the U.S.-Canada Great Lakes Water Quality
 Agreement based on the presence of impairments to beneficial uses (BUIs), such as restrictions on fish and wildlife consumption, loss of fish and wildlife habitat, etc.
- In 1988 the community came together to form a binational public advisory committee (BPAC) to identify projects to address these impairments.
- In 1992 a Remedial Action Plan (RAP) was developed that included specific information about the cause and extent of the impairments in the St. Marys River.
- The St. Marys River RAP identified 10 of the possible 14 BUIs to be addressed for de-listing the AOC.
- In 2002 specific actions were identified by the Stage 2 RAP to address the BUIs.
- Separate, but complementary, restoration actions were developed for the US and Canada.
- Implementation of the Little Rapids Restoration Project (LRRP) completes all major anticipated construction and restoration work in the U.S.
- The US BUIs are expected to be addressed by 2019; actions on the Canadian side of the St. Mary's River AOC are expected to be complete by 2025.
