The Bi-National Public Advisory Council (BPAC) for the St. Marys River Area of Concern supports the Eastern Upper Peninsula Cooperative Weed Management Area (EUP CWMA) on the Eastern Upper Peninsula Cooperative Invasive Species Management Program. The St. Marys BPAC recognizes the negative impact invasive species can have on our watersheds and waterways and are committed to continuing collaborative efforts to prevent, identify, eradicate, and control invasive species throughout the watershed.

With the recent discovery of European Frog-bit in the Munuscong and Raber Bay Areas, as well as increasing occurrences of invasive Phragmites being found further north along the shoreline and wetland areas, the St. Marys BPAC feels it is increasingly important that effort be put forth towards early detection and rapid response as well as proper treatment, prevention, management, and control of invasive species in the St. Marys River.
