EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

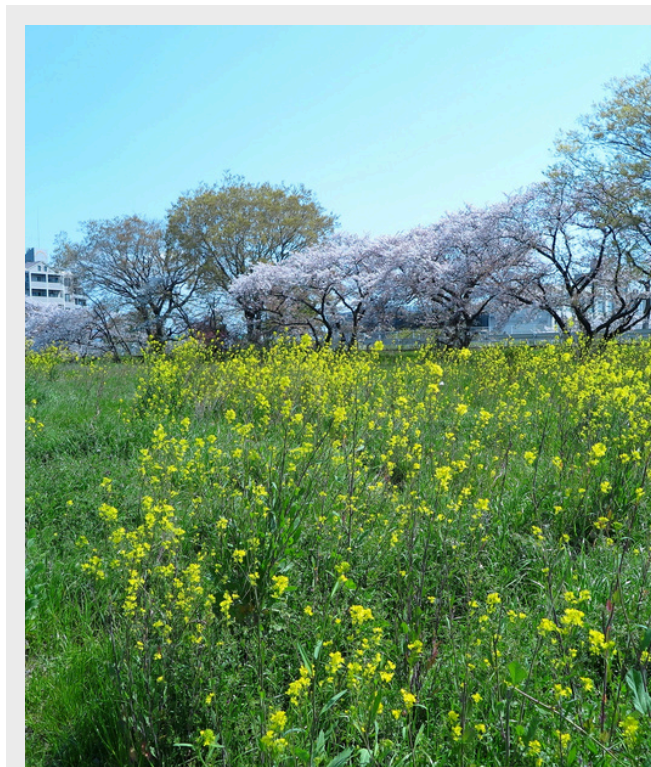
On February 6th, we hosted our first outreach event of the year, a Community Coffee Social at Café 4 Good.

The evening was filled with laughter, ideas, and inspiration, reminding us how powerful community gatherings can be in strengthening our shared commitment to the river.

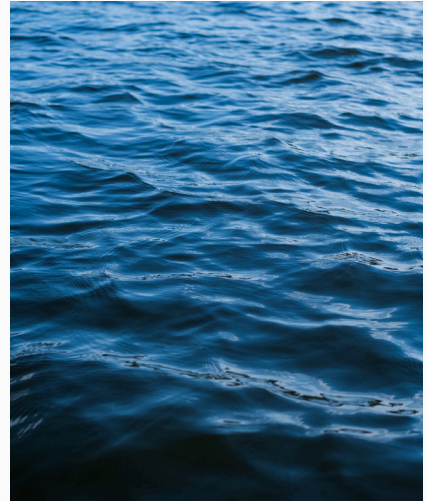
Thank you to everyone who joined us and helped kick off 2026 with such positive energy.
